

Registration Information:

All American Montessori Preschool is a 4-day a week program, meeting Monday through Thursday. The class is from 8:45 a.m. - 11:45 a.m.

Children must be 3 by September 1, 2009 and fully potty-trained in order to be enrolled.

Tuition is \$190.00 per month and due by the 5th of each month.

Registration fee is \$50.00 per child, is non-refundable and due at time of registration.

(Registration fee will be waived if fee for the 2009-2010 school year has been paid at another local preschool.)

There is a materials/supply fee of \$50.00 per child.

Class begins on Tuesday, September 8th (after Labor Day) and the last class will be Friday, May 28th, 2010.

All American Montessori Preschool is a place *"where children learn"*.

Our Montessori classroom is enriched with hands-on activities which allow children to spontaneously develop at their own pace according to their own capabilities and in a non-competitive atmosphere. The curriculum is multicultural, faith based and non-sexist.

Our classroom consists of multi-age children (3, 4 and 5 year olds) and is non-discriminating regarding race or creed.

Our classroom is limited to 16 children with two teachers. Debbie Cleveland, our lead teacher, is a certified Montessori Preschool Teacher and has been teaching in the Tri-Cities area for over 10 years.

Classroom materials, which are creative and stimulating, are arranged on the shelves in an orderly manner for children to use. The classroom is divided into areas of learning: **Practical Life Exercises**, build concentration and small muscle development, through pouring, cutting, sorting, polishing, etc. and are very satisfying to the child; **The Sensorial Materials**, which help children use their senses to define color, shape, weight, sound and smell; **The Academic Materials**, which patiently await each child's developing interest in reading, math, geography and science.



The colorful manipulative, multi-sensory materials, allow each child to set the pace of his/her own learning. By doing work at their own sense of readiness, it becomes fun, exciting and rewarding to your child.

Repetition and completeness of materials allows each child to move from simple to complex at his or her own developmental rate of readiness and interest.

Children learn social skills and how to problem solve by interacting with others. They are encouraged to make good choices and decisions in a safe and caring environment. As a result of using communication and understanding of their self, your child will develop independence and a positive self-concept.
